PRESIDENT'S REPORT

I have been involved with our Association for more than 10 years and have participated as a parent, coach, VP Recreational, Treasurer, Executive V.P. and now President. 2014 was the best year ever for NDG Soccer, our registration numbers increased so more players of all ages were playing organized soccer. . Our competitive division had 1 AAA, 6 Senior, and 24 A/AA teams for a total of 31. Our recreational division had many more young children joining our teams and also had an increase in the adult leagues with a total of 106 teams. Soccer really is for everyone!

We continued to improve our technical program with Mahfoud Tahri, NDGSA Technical Director and Christian Horst Schuller, NDGSA Recreational Technical Director. They and the technical staff worked intensively with players and coaches throughout the summer season. Our volunteer coaches continue to attend the FSQ certification courses at all levels which means our association offers a very high caliber of coaching to our players.

We have continued to work very closely with the Ville de Montreal and would like to thank April Leger, Peggy Papadakis and Kenneth Whittaker for all their assistance, encouragement and support. We thank Sheryl Gill and Comité Jeunesse NDG for their assistance with our major events, their help is invaluable.

Our association was named as a finalist for "Sports Association of the Year" for 2014 by the Concordia Regional Soccer Association. We also were awarded "Event of the Year 2014" for our Icebreaker Tournament and Our Technical Director-Referees, Mr. Evans Vellozo, was awarded "Official of the Year 2014" by the CDN/NDG Borough.

I would like, on behalf of all players, coaches and families in our NDG Soccer community to state our thanks and appreciation for our major sponsor **Royal LePage Ville Marie**. Georges Gaucher and his team's sponsorship have allowed our association to improve and expand our programming. VP RECREATIONAL DIVISION REPORT - 2014

The recreational division of the NDG Soccer Association organized summer soccer for 1,709 players and 160 coaches. While there has been a noticeable drop-off in the numbers of teenagers over the years, we have remained relatively stable this year in our various full-field divisions which is a reflection of the effort from both the administration and coaches to create a positive environment for our children. We again wished to thank Royal Lepage – Newton Group for their generous support of the NDGSA Recreational Division. The highlights of our summer and winter programs are summarized as follows.

Novice Division

Our numbers in our U4, 5 & 6 divisions continue to grow and amounted to 488 children in 2014 which was slightly less than in 2013. We were able to maintain both boy's and girl's divisions which has proven very beneficial and is welcomed by the parents. Allstar teams were formed in the U4M, U5M, U6F, and U6M divisions and they played in outside tournaments.

Mini-field Division

The mini-field division operated well in 2014 with few problems. Coaches were found for all teams and the games were equally competitive. Highlights include:-

- The total number of girls and boys in this division amounted to 172 and 439 respectively.
- The mini-field division included U7, U8, U9, and U10 boy's divisions and U7/8 and U9/10 girl's divisions.
- Allstar teams were formed in the U7M, U8M, U9M, U10M, U7F and U8F divisions and teams played in 2 tournaments.
- The CSA Mini Soccer festival was held in August with Novice (U4/5/6) and Minifield Girls playing on Saturday and the Minifield Boys on Sunday. The festival was a great success - a credit to Cate, Maddie, Rino and the coaches.

Full-Field Divisions

This year, we continued to have U12, U14, and U17 divisions for both girls and boys. Highlights include:-

- The total number of girls/women and boys/men in this division amounted to 147 and 217 respectively.
- As a part of our development program, the U12F & M and U14F&M division's games were played on a 9v9 format on modified $\frac{3}{4}$ fields.
- As the numbers of players in the U17F division were lower than normal, this division was formed into 2 teams which played against each other.
- Allstar teams were formed in the U12F, U14M, U17F, and U14M divisions and these teams played in 1-2 tournaments.
- The finals for all full field divisions were held on the weekend of September 6/7, 2014. The T-shirts given out to the various winners were sponsored by the NDG Free Press. Judging by the parents and friends in the stands, the event was very successful.
- We initiated an annual T-shirt design contest in 2013. Our congratulations go to this year's winner, Blandine Anglehart.

In an effort to continue to provide the most balanced teams in every age category, preseason player evaluation sessions were held to assign an evaluation to players who had never been affiliated with NDGSA before.

Senior / Coach's Divisions

We continue to promote soccer among seniors (U18+) to give everyone an opportunity to play a recreational game of soccer. There were 253 players registered in the senior leagues plus a NDGSA coaches team. Highlights include:-

- We successfully developed two 4 team divisions in the men's league with a U29M division and a U30+ division. Thanks go to Mark Blaker & Maureen Scully for organizing the U29M division.
- Four teams were formed in senior women's league, a league for women 18 and older.
- The finals for the senior divisions were held on the weekend of September 6/7, 2014

Referees

Clinics for the referees were presented by Concordia in the spring in preparation for the 2014 season and all new referees attended. We also provided our refresher course under the instruction of Evans Velloza to all returning referees. The co-ordination of the recreational referees was under the control of Maddie with technical assistance from Evans. We experienced virtually no problems in 2013 and our thanks and appreciation go to both Maddie and Evans.

Coaches

The success of our programs is dependent on our coaches, assistant coaches, and other volunteers. With a few minor exceptions, we were able to field both coaches and assistant coaches for all teams. Our goal remains to develop younger. We heartily thank all of our coaches and assistants for their dedication to our recreational program.

Technical

In 2014, the NDGSA Executive continued their emphasis on the training and development of our recreational U4 - 12 players. Our Recreational Technical Director, Christian Horst Schuller, assisted by Calin Ordean, Ovidu Olten, and William Veloce provided training sessions to coaches in May, training sessions to every team approximately every 2 weeks during the summer soccer season, individual player training sessions on Saturdays during the summer, as well as running special Saturday and Tuesday night sessions for all players in September & October. As well, Christian & his group provided assistance to the Allstar coaches..

We have expanded our Recreational Soccer School programs to include sessions in the Spring, Summer, Fall, and Winter.

Winter Soccer

We continue to expand our winter program with children ranging in ages from U4 to U17. Our goal remains to continue to expand this program in 2014 to a soccer school format.

Administrative

The recreational program continues to be efficiently administered by Cate and Maddie whose time and efforts are greatly appreciated by the NDGSA Executive, coaches and parents.

Senior Report for the AGA for NDGSA

State of the Senior Divisions.....

NDGSA continues to display it's importance to the senior program within Concordia with 5 senior teams in 2014 and we will continue with 5 teams this summer 2015. We are still one of the winningest clubs in Concordia with both our Division 2 Men's Team and Division 2 Women's teams winning their respective championships.

Because of NDG's geographical location we can still attract Seniors from both the NDG borrows and other neighbouring boroughs to put together competitive teams and remain one of the top Clubs at the Senior level within Concordia. The senior programs have had a lot of interest and will continue to grow as long as Concordia Region can offer a decent product (Divisions) for our Seniors to play in. Registrations are in full swing for senior player's and the outlook is very positive.

Some of the biggest challenges we are tackling at this moment are keeping our player's within the NDG organization, player's that are moving from Juvenile to Senior status, because of the ease of mobility to transfer to other clubs, but as long as we can offer and continue to offer a good program for these future potentials our Senior program will stay strong. The one area that will need some work will be the Women's Divisions within Concordia which is probably the weakest of all regions. The other regions are strong and continue to build on that strength while Concordia lacks initiative to help improve it's women's program.

On the men's side there is room to grow as far as divisions are concerned and the focus will be on the lower divisions for them. We have the coaching staff, we just need to find the player's and grow from there. We should have this summer 3 very solid teams in Concordia.

One factor we continue to explore is funding from local businesses for our Senior teams. Community interest from our local business enterprises could help grow the interest and the level of the game offered by NDGSA. With help from local enterprises we could entertain the possibility of Senior AAA teams at some point, therefore increasing the level of interest for the game in the area, delivering a quality product most never get to see, maintaining our

better player's in the area and attracting more interest from outside coaches and players. We would also at the same time be giving our juvenile teams inspiration of a quality soccer and keeping them in sport. So we will be looking for support from the enterprises in our area for help.

En 2014, j'ai parcouru l'annuaire des subventions au Québec afin d'identifier des commanditaires potentiels pour l'ASNDG. Une dizaine de commanditaires potentiels ont été contactés, mais sans succès. Nous avons quand même réussi à finaliser l'entente avec la Caisse Populaire Desjardins après des mois de négociations, et nous avons aussi signé avec deux autres nouveaux commanditaires, Paramount et Subaru. Ces trois commanditaires nous apportent 17 500\$ en commandite et ont signifié leur intérêt d'être avec nous à long terme, même si certains ne pouvaient signer des ententes que d'une durée d'un an. Equipment Director Report to the Annual General Assembly

Since assuming the position of equipment director last October the following tasks have been accomplished:

- The locker has been completely cleaned and organised
- All House League coach bag have been emptied and contents sorted
- All first aid kits have been emptied and restocked
- All balls have been sorted into scrap, donation or keep and deflated for storage
- Pinnies have also been sorted and washed
- Old overstock of shorts has been cycled into the current equipment order to lower the cost of this seasons uniforms

Chance to Play is an organisation that sends soccer equipment to over 25 locations worldwide. After separating everything in the locker into good, donate or garbage, a donation package was made and delivered. Examples of what was given:

- Nearly 600 old jerseys
- Approximately 100 old balls
- Over 100 discontinued models of shorts
- Over 50 pairs of discontinued socks
- 31 unused trophies
- Over 50 pairs of used goalie gloves
- Various referee suits and equipment

The Competitive division will receive their uniforms in middle of April and the Recreational will receive theirs the beginning of May.

Due to great efforts of Christian DeSerres, the association will receive over 6 new pop-up gazebos free of charge from various sponsors.
